The five story, 20 room cliff dwelling served as a "high-rise apartment building" for prehistoric Sinagua Indians over 600 years ago.	1
Tuzigoot Nat'l Monument	Camp Verde	AZ	928-634-5564	www.nps.gov/tuzi/	This ancient village, or pueblo, was built by a culture known as the Sinagua, agriculturalists with trade connections that spanned hundreds of miles. The pueblo consisted of 110 rooms, including second and third story structures.	1

When the first Europeans arrived, all that remained of this ancient culture were the ruins of villages, irrigation canals, and various artifacts.	2

The people farmed in the Salt River Valley and supplemented their diet by hunting and gathering native wildlife and plants.	2
Organ Pipe Cactus Nat'l Monument	Ajo	AZ	520-387-6849	www.nps.gov/orpi/	Celebrate the life and landscape of the Sonora Desert here, in this desert wilderness of plants, animals, dramatic mountains and plains scenery. The Monument exhibits an extraordinary collection of plants of the Sonoran Desert, including the organ pipe cactus, a large cactus rarely found in the United States.	3
