The park was established to protect this grand and colorful geologic feature, as well as the unique historical and cultural history found in the area.	18
Pipe Springs Nat'l Monument	Fredonia	AZ	928-643-7105	<a href="http://www.nps.gov/pisp/">www.nps.gov/pisp/</a>	The Pipe Spring Ranch was home to ancestral Puebloans and Kaibab Paiute Indians for at least 1,000 years. In the 1870s, Mormon pioneers built a fort over the main spring and established a cattle ranching operation.	19
Cedar Breaks Nat'l Monument	Cedar City	UT	435-586-9451	<a href="http://www.nps.gov/cebr/">www.nps.gov/cebr/</a>	A huge natural amphitheater has been eroded out of the variegated Pink Cliffs. Millions of years of sedimentation, uplift and erosion have created a 2,000 foot deep canyon of rock walls, fins, spires and columns that spans some 3 miles.	19
Zion Nat'l Park	Springdale	UT	435-772-3256	<a href="http://www.nps.gov/zion/">www.nps.gov/zion/</a>	Protected within the park's 229 square miles is a dramatic landscape of sculptured canyons and soaring cliffs. Zion is located at the junction of the Colorado Plateau, Great Basin and Mojave Desert provinces, where unique geography and the variety of life zones make Zion significant for its unusual plant and animal diversity.	19
